

Make dinner for the family. Find a recipe, gather and measure out ingredients, and make something delicious.




Find a recipe online for homemade ice cream and make some for your family




Go for a walk after dark and identify constellations.

Take a virtual tour of the seven wonders of the world — go online and see what you can learn about each.




Start a book club with your friends.






Invent your own board game. Come up with a concept, write the rules, design the board, build and play!

Go to the library and find a new author you have never read before.




Write a letter to an out-of-state friend or relative, and ask them to write back.







## Plant a garden. Find out what grows best in your area and watch it grow!
